Scripture reading - 'Concerning Spiritual gifts' 1 Corinthians Ch 12 vs 1 - 11

- **12** Now about the gifts of the Spirit, brothers and sisters, I do not want you to be uninformed. **2** You know that when you were pagans, somehow or other you were influenced and led astray to mute idols. **3** Therefore I want you to know that no one who is speaking by the Spirit of God says, "Jesus be cursed," and no one can say, "Jesus is Lord," except by the Holy Spirit.
- **4** There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. **5** There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord.
- **6** There are different kinds of working, but in all of them and in everyone it is the same God at work. **7** Now to each one the manifestation of the Spirit is given for the common good. **8** To one there is given through the Spirit a message of wisdom, to another a message of knowledge by means of the same Spirit, **9** to another faith by the same Spirit, to another gifts of healing by that one Spirit, **10** to another miraculous powers, to another prophecy, to another distinguishing between spirits, to another speaking in different kinds of tongues, and to still another the interpretation of tongues.**11** All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, and he distributes them to each one, just as he determines.

Reflection for today

In my chosen scripture St Paul is writing to the church in Corinth. Chapter 12 offers much for our 'spiritual nourishment' and understanding of the Holy Spirit. It is often over shadowed by the more regularly read Chapter 13 - all about the indispensability of love. Love is of course is the first mentioned 'fruit of the Spirit' in his Letter to the Galations (ch 5). But since the Spirit is 'the source' it probably should come first, so to speak.

In a few weeks time the Christian church worldwide will celebrate Pentecost - the day the Holy Spirit came upon the first apostles. Let us look forward to those celebrations and sermons and special days. For now, in our worship thought today, I encourage you to celebrate (and then indeed put to work) the <u>gifts</u> of the Spirit that are (and have been) in abundance in community, and thereby bring honour and glory to the Lord.

You have just read the scripture in Corinthians Ch 12. Maybe it is a little confusing or even frightening to think that such things are at work among us. But they are. Now is not the time to dissect the passage phrase by phrase. However it is a good time to be informed. (Note that St Paul in the first verse writes 'I don't want you to be uninformed'!)

I ask no more study at this time than you read the few notes that follow here:

Bible footnotes -

Vs 2. At one time the Corinthians has been led by various influences to worship mute idols, but now they are to be led by the Holy Spirit.

Vs 4-6. These verses show the diversity and unity of spiritual gifts. Gifts of grace produced by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. But they all point in the same direction and serve the same Lord.

Vs 7. Every member of the Body of Christ has been given some spiritual gift that is an evidence of the Spirit's working in their lives. All the gifts are intended to build up the Christian community - they are not to be used for selfish advantage.

Vs 8-10. Note the breadth of the gifts and the way in which a Christian community can together be a mutual blessing.

Vs 11. The Holy Spirit sovereignly determines which gift of gifts each believer should have.

As we sit at home or otherwise use this service for our private devotion and worship, we would do well to appreciate that faith is a living thing, a constantly regenerated and stimulated thing, a dynamic representation of the presence of God in the lives of followers of Jesus Christ.

In today's call to worship Psalm 19 - we read 'The heavens declare the glory of God; the skies proclaim the work of his hands'. I believe this to be true but I also believe that we are called to give expression to what we hear, see and understand about our relationship with our creator God. Christopher Idle was not true to his surname - but he was true to his Lord, and shared his thoughts poetically.

The work of the Holy Spirit in us all, if only we would recognise it.

The scriptures remind us:

There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit distributes them. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord.

The Servant King song 'includes the line' - For it is Christ we are serving.

How may we all be more fruitful this coming week? A few year's ago our house-group followed a very encouraging study course called 'Fruitfulness on the front line'. (Author - Mark Greene). Highly recommended by me. In a key chapter called Ministering Grace and Love he emphasises the principle of Christian outreach in terms of actions that are beyond what we <u>have to do</u>.

That is to say - Grace doesn't have to, but Grace does. Grace is on the lookout for opportunities. Love doesn't have to. But love does. Love is alert to possibilities. I hope you get the sense of being prepared to go the extra mile (and even more).

May we, in the days and weeks ahead, seek to use our gifting and to encourage those around about us to use theirs, in the service of our Lord. So that we might even join with the heavenly realms in offering praise and worship to God. Amen
